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Why procure sustainably?

Government expenditure on public works, goods, and services



EU*

• ~ € 1,8 trillion contract award volume p.a. (14% of GDP)



• > € 61 billion contract award volume p.a. (18% of GDP)

- A material contribution by public authorities to achieving sustainability goals
- Public procurement as an engine for innovation → creates incentives to develop sustainable products & services
- The public sector is especially present in construction, healthcare, and public transport

A Definition - Our Goal

A procurement process that delivers the best possible environmental, social, and economic outcomes over the entire life cycle.



Sustainable Procurement

Summary:



Procure in a resource-conserving manner, as much as necessary and as little as possible (sufficiency).



Look beyond the purchase price - assess total cost of ownership (TCO)



For all procurement categories listed in the naBe Action Plan, at least the naBe baseline environmental criteria shall be applied in tenders and awards



Use credible ecolabels as a reference;

Internal process – how purchasing works at the ÖBS?

- Define the need (only what's necessary sufficiency)
- Do market research (incl. regional suppliers).
- Choose the procedure (per Austrian procurement law)
- Set sustainability criteria (at least naBe baseline; use credible ecolabels)
- with Experts




Participatory Approach – Expert Teams

>80 experts from a wide array of administrative levels and organisational units, divided into 7 thematic clusters.

Advantages:

- Needs-based solutions
- Efficiency gains through product experience
- Quality assurance
- Acceptance & transparency





As a customer



- Get access (user account/roles).
- Pick pre-approved, sustainable products.
- Submit cart (internal approval if needed).
- Place the order (goes to the contracted supplier).
- Delivery & invoice from the supplier directly;
- ÖBS helps with any issues.



Targets and Benefits



Savings - Cash: Result: 23% (University of St. Gallen, 2003)



Savings – Time: Result: 50% (University of St. Gallen, 2003)



Ecological innovation driven by targeted demand:

Example: ecological product choice "copy paper"

- Savings: 1.3 million kWh of electricity, 160 t CO₂
- All products are carbon-neutral



Regional value creation

Result: 80-90% of contractors from Vorarlberg



Legal certainty under procurement law Through use of a central purchasing unit
